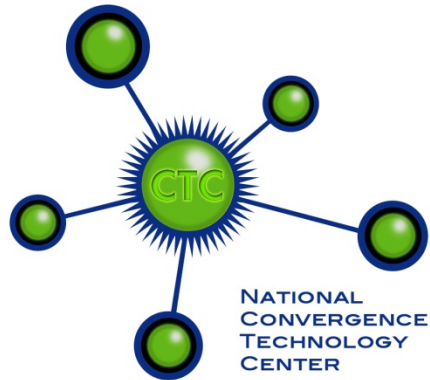

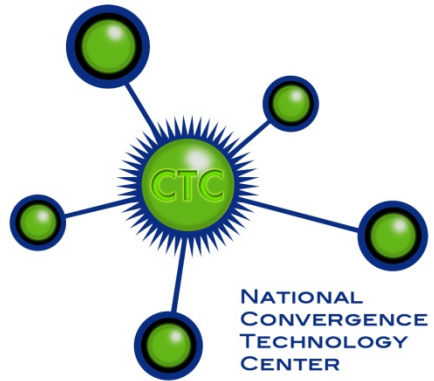
# Rules of Engagement

Implement sustained recruitment plan (2)

Attend/present at IT educator conference (2-5)

Host local recruitment event (2)

Provide content for CTC blog (1)

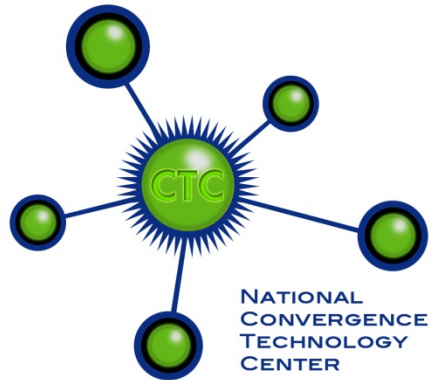
Submit yearly CCN report
